Instructions for submitting hair for 3-panel testing

Please do not write on the hair submittal form.

Getting ready

- 1. Gather the following materials:
 - a. hair submittal form
 - b. self-sealing sandwich-size plastic bag (labeled with horse's name)
 - c. stamped envelope addressed to the ATA office
 - d. scissors or knife to cut the hair after pulling
 - e. hair-pulling instrument (needle-nosed pliers, pen or pencil).

 Needle-nosed pliers work best. You can use a pencil or pen to wrap the hairs around, but you will need to grip the hair very firmly.
 - 2. Clean the pliers of any hair fragments or dirt from previous horses.
 - 3. Thoroughly wash and dry your hands.
 - 4. Horse's tail area should be dry and reasonably clean.
 - 5. Try to stand to the horse's side to avoid being kicked if your horse is jumpy.

Pulling the hair

- 6. Grasp 8-10 hairs from the upper portion of the dock of the tail about 2-3 inches from the skin.
- 7. Turn the hair-pulling instrument to wrap the hairs around the instrument two times.
- 8. Pull in a sharp manner in the same direction as the hairs lay so you pull the hairs out without breaking them off.
- 9. Visually check to be sure you have the white root bulb swellings on the end of the pulled hairs.
- 10. DO NOT TOUCH THE HAIR ROOT BULBS!!
- 11. Cut the hair to about three inches in length
- 12. Put the hair with the root bulbs into the plastic bag.
- 13. Repeat hair pulling until you have at least 60 root bulbs.
- 14. Try to put the hair into the bag with all the root bulbs to the same side.

Sending the hair sample

- 15. Fold the hair submittal form around the plastic bag; put it in the envelope.
- 16. Mail to the address below. If mailing from outside the United States, a current import permit must accompany the sample.
